Legislative Affairs

CAPT Don Giles, USN (Ret) - VP for Legislative Affairs

We have seven Senators and 77 Representatives that are newly elected and scheduled to join the 118 Congress on January 3: Two of the new Representatives are assigned to our Atlanta Metropolitan Council: Rich McCormick R-GA6 and Mike Collins R-GA10. If you have interest in participating on our Legislative Affairs Committee as an assigned constituent, please call me at 770-509-3772. We will ask for an office visit with them in February or March to provide a brief that will introduce them to the Navy League, our purpose, mission priorities for our Maritime Services, and our council initiatives.

The House and the Senate have released the final text for the 2023 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA). It calls for a topline of \$847 billion (\$45 billion above the President's request) and includes a 4.6% pay raise for servicemembers.

Our Legislative Affairs Advocacy Initiatives in the new year include:

- 1. Establishing rapport and regular office contact with new Members of Congress.
- 2. Preparing a Budget Priorities Brief for a "Hill Surge" that will occur in April-June with hybrid virtual and in-person district meetings with our Members of Congress. With the President's 2024 Budget expected to drop around the first week of February, we anticipate a frenzy of activity to include the publishing of sea service unfunded priority lists and solicitation by congressional offices for input on appropriations priorities
- 3. Monthly Legislative Affairs Training every fourth Monday of the month at 4:00 p.m. ET, sometimes rescheduled if coinciding with a holiday.
- 4. An in-person "Fly-in" in November 2023 during the National Board of Directors Meeting. Details are expected to include a breakfast with the Shipbuilding Caucus, appointments with as many Members of Congress as we can schedule, and possibly a Center for Maritime Strategy War Game event at NLUS Headquarters.
- 5. Confirming commitment of our volunteer advocates for CY-2023 and trying to find a few new volunteers to ensure that we have at least one Navy League member from each congressional district. We have assigned constituents for eight of 12 Members of Congress assigned to our council.

New constituents are needed for these Members of Congress:

- a. 5th Nikema Williams [D]
- b. 10th Mike Collins [R] New MOC
- c. 13th David Scott [D
- d. 14th Marjorie Taylor Greene [R]

Remember that our core Navy League purpose is education of our fellow citizens. Bob Wise, Jr.

Captain Harold R. (Bob) Wise, Jr. received his B.S. Degree in Education from West Chester University, West Chester, Pennsylvania in May of 1964 and his MBA in International Business from Kennesaw State University, Kennesaw, Georgia in December of 1999. He was commissioned an Ensign in the United States Navy Reserve upon graduation from Officer Candidate School, Newport, Rhode Island in February 1965. After completing studies at Naval Damage Control Training Center, Philadelphia, PA, he was assigned to USS Intrepid (CV-11) where he served as Division Officer, Engineering Watch Officer and Damage Control Assistant. He made deployments in the Atlantic, Caribbean and Western Pacific including duty in Vietnam waters.

In May 1967, Captain Wise reported for duty at Naval Damage Control Training Center, Philadelphia, PA as an instructor. He returned to the inactive Navy Reserve in May of 1969 and retired 1 July 1995. During his 30 plus year career in both active and reserve duty assignments, he served in several leadership positions including Commanding Officer, Auxiliary Floating Drydock Medium 104, Trenton, NJ; Assistant Programs Officer, Naval Reserve Readiness Command Region Four, Philadelphia, PA.; Plans Officer, CINCEASTLANT 108, Atlanta, GA; Communications Officer, SACLANT Det. 205, Buffalo, NY; Director of Training, Naval Reserve Center, Buffalo, NY; Management Information and Retention Officer, Naval Reserve Readiness Command Region Eight, Jacksonville, FL.; Commanding Officer, Naval Reserve Voluntary Training Unit 0801, Atlanta, GA; Assistant Inspector General and Assistant Director of Plans for Readiness, Naval Reserve Readiness Command Region Eight, Jacksonville, FL.; Commanding Officer, Naval Reserve Readiness Unit "C", Atlanta, GA; Director of Selected Reserve Training, Naval Reserve Readiness Center, Atlanta, GA; and Explosives Safety Inspector, Naval Ordnance Center, Indian Head Division, Naval Surface Warfare Center, Naval Sea Systems Command, Washington, DC.

Captain Wise attended the Naval War College, served as a member of the Secretary of the Navy's National Naval Reserve Policy Board for three years, served on the Naval Reserve Readiness Command Region Eight, Jacksonville, FL's Reserve Policy Board for three years, completed the Reserve Components National Security Course presented by the National Defense University, attended the Armed Forces Staff College, attended the Naval War College War Gaming course and served on several Navy Reserve Officer line and staff selection boards.

He is the past National President of the National Naval Officers Association, the past National Vice President of the Association of the United States Navy (Naval Reserve Association) and currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors and Treasurer for the Atlanta Council – Navy League of the United States.

Captain Wise's civilian employment included working at IBM for almost 20 years in a variety of technical, educational, marketing and management positions, Regional Sales Manager for Emerson Electric's Computer Power Division, Equifax Inc., where he

served as Director of Sales Training, Director of Data Security, Director of Systems Services and Director of Fulfillment Services, Kennesaw State University as the Director of Development, and the Board of Regents as the Assistant Director of the University System of Georgia's (USG) African-American Male Initiative (AAMI), a state-wide program aimed at increasing the recruitment, retention and graduation of Black males from the USG's public colleges and universities.

Captain Wise was awarded the Navy Meritorious Service Medal, the Navy "E", the National Defense Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal with two stars, the Armed Forces Reserve Medal with hourglass, the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal, the Expert Rifle Medal, the Sharpshooter Pistol Ribbon and Command Ashore Pin.
