#### Welcome Aboard!

The Atlanta Metropolitan Navy League Council was awarded Outstanding Council for 5 of the past 10 years. Usually, only about 14 of 180 National Councils are given this honor. Here is what we do to create that outstanding environment for the League:

- Our Board of Directors meets monthly every second Tuesday at 7:00 p.m. at the Navy Talent Acquisition Group Atlanta in Smyrna, GA. However, since the pandemic, we have been meeting online. Members are always welcome to attend. If you would like to join our Zoom meeting, please email or call me, and I will send you the login information.
- General Membership events are scheduled about 4 times a year. We host a banquet for the outstanding Navy and Marine Corps cadets from 45 JROTC units and 7 Sea Cadet Units that we support. These "Outstanding Metro-Atlanta Cadets" will be announced at the Annual Youth Awards Banquet in May.
- We have interesting Keynote Speakers at our member events, often Flag Officers, and noteworthy civilians. We will have the Navy Ball and attend the ARMAC Luncheon in the fall. In December, there will be the Marine Corp. Toys for Tots Dinner.
- Trips to Maritime Services Bases or events are planned periodically. For example, members went to NAS

Pensacola to visit the National Naval Aviation Museum and the Blue Angels during their practices.

- Project Mail Call will happen on September 30 this year.
- > We elect officers and directors annually via a slate sent to all members by mail. Our by-laws also allow the Board to add directors by vote. A new slate is presented to the Board and mailed in November to the Council members (about 175 right now). That annual mailing includes a local Council dues appeal (\$25 annually). The mailing also asks members to consider a donation to our "Leadership Fund" which is used to support youth programs and leadership awards to top sailors and marines in our sponsored and adopted units. We also support USS Jimmy Carter, USS Georgia (gold and blue), Naval Operational Support Center (NOSC) Atlanta, and Navy Talent Acquisition Group Atlanta.
- We communicate by <u>eNewsletter</u>, our <u>Council website</u>, Facebook (please like and share!), and <u>email</u>. Also, sharing our noteworthy events will significantly increase our footprint.

# Youth Program Update

The Atlanta Metropolitan Navy League Council currently <u>provides support</u> to 45 Navy and Marine Corps JROTC units. The unit breakdown is as follows:

- 1. Of the 45 units, there are 34 NJROTC units and 11 MCJROTC units.
- 2. The Chief of Navy Education and Training has reorganized the assignment and placement of units, as well as the establishment of several new Area Command. The Georgia units were formally assigned to Area 12 based in Jacksonville, FL.
- 3. 28 of the 34 NJROTC units supported by the Council have been assigned to the newly formed Area 9, composed of Georgia units in the designated Atlanta and surrounding metropolitan areas. Focus on managing the Metro Atlanta assets.
- 4. Of the 6 remaining NJROTC units, the 5 units located in South Georgia will continue their assignment in Area 12, and the lone unit in Alabama will continue in its present assignment.
- 5. The total number of NJROTC cadets in our area for this year is 5,098.

The Atlanta Metropolitan Navy League Council currently provides support to 7 Naval Sea Cadet Command units in the Northeast Region. The unit breakdown is as follows:

- 1. There are a total of 80 cadets currently training in the program.
- 2. Of the 7 units, 2 are currently without commanding officers. The Sea Cadet Regional Director is working to fill these positions.
- 3. The Council provides \$500.00 annually to each unit. The Council does not direct where this money is to be allocated, but the preference is for the fund to support summer training. Recent annual unit inspections reveal that the units are using the funds to support summer training. On some occasions, the funds were reallocated to purchase uniform items for summer training.

The 2023 graduation rate among NJROTC seniors is higher than the state average and most of the county school districts. Roughly 95.6% of NJROTC seniors are graduating, as compared to the state average of 84.4. The graduation percentages of the "Big 3" districts in metro Atlanta school districts are as follows:

- 1. Fulton 89.3%
- 2. Cobb 87.4%
- 3. Gwinnett 83.2%

## Where Are They Now?

### Commander Paul "Disco" Ritter, USN

From 1998 through 2001, Ritter was an NJROTC Cadet at North Cobb/Harrison High Schools in Cobb County, Georgia, under the leadership of Senior Naval Science Instructor CDR Frank Campbell, USN (ret). As is evident by his ribbon rack, Cadet Ritter was an active member of the NJROTC program.

After graduating from high school, Ritter attended Auburn University in 2005 and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Business Administration, Finance.

He earned his designation of Naval Aviator in June 2008. CDR Ritter reported to VAQ-129 at NAS Whidbey Island for initial fleet training as an EA-6B Prowler Pilot.

He began operational flying in June 2010 with the "Cougars" of Electronic Attack Squadron 139 (VAQ-139). He completed a deployment aboard USS *Ronald Reagan* (CVN-76) with Carrier Air Wing *Fourteen* (CVW-14) in support of Operation Tomodachi and combat operations New Dawn and Enduring Freedom. Upon completion of the deployment, LCDR Ritter and VAQ-139 transitioned to the EA-18G Growler in 2012.

Reporting to the "Vikings" of VAQ-129 as Fleet **Replenishment Squadron** (FRS) Instructor, Ritter served until May 2015 when he was selected for the Growler Weapons Tactics Instructor Course (GTI) at Airborne Electronic Attack Weapons School (HAVOC), Class 02-15. He then reported to the "Shadowhawks" of VAQ-141 in Atsugi, Japan, and aboard CVN 76 with Carrier Air Wing Five (CVW-5) in November 2015. As Training Officer and Chairman of the CVW-5 Standardization Board, he completed 3 WESTPAC patrols.

Reporting for his Department Head tour, CDR Ritter again checked into VAQ-139 in March 2017. He completed two combat deployments aboard USS *Theodore Roosevelt* (CVN-71) and USS *Nimitz* (CVN-68) with Carrier Air Wing





Seventeen (CVW-17), supporting Operations Inherent Resolve and Freedom's Sentinel as a Strike Lead and SEAD Lead Mission Commander.

In January 2021, CDR Ritter checked into Naval Air Warfighting Development

Center (NAWDC) in Fallon, Nevada, where he was the Assistant Department Head (N10A) of HAVOC.

In January 2023, he reported as Executive Officer to Electronic Attack Squadron 136 (VAQ-136) "Gauntlets," where he now proudly serves as Commanding Officer.

CDR Ritter's awards include the Meritorious Service Medal, Strike/Flight Air Medal, Navy Commendation Medal (three awards), Navy/Marine Corp Achievement Medal, and various personal and service awards. He has over 2,800 flight hours in the EA-6B and EA-18G and 585 carrier-arrested landings.

CDR Ritter is married to Nicole Kimsey Ritter of Milton, Georgia. They have a daughter, Emma (13), and a son Blake (8).
